Activity: Your own rights-based approach Theme: Becoming a Youth Rights Champion

In order to become a Youth Rights Champion,

a youth and survivor led, rights-based participation project

we are asking you to support a group of young people you work with to develop their own rightsbased approach that can be applied at your work place. This is an opportunity to hear directly from young people about what's working and where things can be improved. This activity is based on the format our own rights-based infographic so we have provided a blank template for you to use on page two.



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Follow the steps below to create your own rights-based approach.

Share the <u>UN Convention on the Rights of the Child</u> to ensure young people know their rights and <u>our infographic</u> so they can see how other young people have interpreted some of these rights.

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Ask young people to choose which rights/articles they want to interpret. Put one article in each of the bubbles. You can print out multiple sheets if needed.

Now ask the young people to decide what it would look like to have these rights fully met. Use the text boxes attached to the bubbles to write these out.

Finally, use the boxes at the top of the page to decide who is responsible for making this happen and how you will know if it's working*. Nobody can do this alone so it's worth discussing this with your colleagues and managers.
